## Mechanism for the transparent nomination of WG members to lead specific activities

#### Five steps

- 1. Draft activity ToRs to be developed by the Workstreams;
- 2. Call for Partner applications to lead activities;
- 3. Review committees formulated;
- 4. Activity and ToRs reviewed;
- 5. Co-Chairs to select the lead Partners on activities.



## Mechanism for the transparent nomination of WG members to lead specific activities

#### 1. Draft activity ToRs to be developed by the Work streams

- CMWG Activity Plan circulated to all CMWG members to review the validity of activities and ensure that they are not duplicative;
- Work streams to confirm selection of activities and develop draft ToRs.

#### 2. Call for Partner applications to lead activities

- Work stream members should be invited to put their organisations forward to lead activities
- A caveat for consideration is whether exceptions are made for any activities where a change of lead Partner at this stage will be highly disruptive.

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### **Knowledge Management**

In its efforts to constantly improve its effectiveness, RBM has identified the need to develop and implement a Knowledge Management (KM) Strategy

- Mandated a task force
- Contracted a KM consultant

#### Objective of a KM Strategy for RBM is

- to improve synergies among all Partners
- to avoid duplications and
- to enable coordinated action at country level

### Better management of knowledge should result in measurable outcomes at four different levels

- 1. Increasing Individual effectiveness;
- 2. Increasing effectiveness of RBM mechanisms and the Secretariat;
- 3. Increasing RBM-wide effectiveness;
- 4. Contributing to improved KM and coordination within the global public health community.

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### **Knowledge Management**


Knowledge management in RBM can be mapped according to four main areas:

- 1. Key knowledge users
- 2. Key knowledge areas
- 3. Key knowledge tools and frameworks
- 4. Key knowledge intensive processes and event

The analysis of the current state of KM in RBM revealed that a number of "low tech/low cost" KM improvement opportunities (Quick Wins) exist in relation to each of the above mentioned four levels.

Fifth Meeting of the RBM Partnership Case Management Working Group (CMWG) 27th - 28th July 2011 Geneva, Switzerland

RBM Objective 1. Reduce global malaria deaths to near zero by end 2015 in areas where public health facilities are able to provide a parasitological test to all suspected malaria cases

Target 1.1 Achieve universal access to case management in the public sector.

By end 2013, 100% of suspected cases receive a malaria diagnostic test and 100% of confirmed cases receive treatment with appropriate and effective antimalarial drugs.

Target 1.2 Achieve universal access to case management, or appropriate referral, in the private sector.

<u>By end 2015</u>, 100% of suspected cases receive a malaria diagnostic test and 100% of confirmed cases receive treatment with appropriate and effective antimalarial drugs.

Target 1.3 Achieve universal access to community case management (CCM) of malaria <u>Bv</u> end 2015, in countries where CCM of malaria is an appropriate strategy, 100% of fever (suspected) cases receive a malaria diagnostic test and 100% of confirmed uncomplicated cases receive treatement with appropriate and effective antimalarial drugs, and 100% of suspected and confirmed severe cases receive appropriate referral.
